



Dear Friends,

This year has been unlike any other, but as we move toward a time when the pandemic may be behind us, I wanted to share some things I learned in the past eight months.

From the day in March when we realized we were facing a global pandemic, the outpouring of support for our work from the community has been incredible. People signed up in record numbers to volunteer, donate items for our seniors, and to contribute financially to our mission. After an evening run to Target during the heatwave, one of our donors dropped fans off at an employee's home so we could get them to clients the next morning! Restaurants and bakeries, who were struggling themselves, brought our overworked staff lunches and cookies. Airport Home Appliance donated microwaves to clients, and Diablo Valley Signs printed signs and banners for us. Partnerships developed between us and County Connection, Mt. Diablo Unified School District, civic and church groups, and many towns and cities.

In addition to increasing our meal delivery by 40%, we also had the extra expense of purchasing PPE and hiring temporary staff to help meet the demand. None of this could have taken place without the support of our donors — their generosity had a major impact on the lives of vulnerable seniors. One donor told us that even though she is on a fixed income, she still donates because what we do is so important.

Thanks to the support we received from local foundations, we were able to develop programs that helped us meet gaps in our services, like the Breakfast Bag Program, the Grocery Bag Program, and Friendly Helpers.

I was inspired firsthand by the unwavering dedication of the MOW Diablo Region staff to go the extra mile to make sure seniors received a delivered meal, got a prescription picked up, or heard a friendly voice on the other end of the phone. All this gave me confidence that once life turns back to normal, we will continue to be a strong and supportive community that cares for our vulnerable seniors.

HOW OUR HEALTH AND WELLNESS DEPARTMENT IS ADAPTING DURING THE PANDEMIC

The Health and Wellness Department at Meals on Wheels Diablo Region continues to develop inventive ways to keep our clients active and safe during the pandemic. Our clients now participate in programs like Bingocize® or Tai Chi, either outdoors and socially distanced or remotely through Zoom classes.

Our Bingocize® program, is designed to increase physical activity and reduce sedentary behavior. Bingocize is an evidence-based program that combines a bingo-like game with exercise and health education. The program has been shown to increase older adults' functional fitness, health knowledge, and social engagement in a variety of settings.

"It's more important than ever that we stay connected with our clients, to help improve well-being and sustain their independence," says Meals on Wheels Diablo Region's Health and Wellness Manager, Cynthia Black.

Additionally, MOW Diablo Region coordinates Tuesday/Thursday 10:00am outdoor Tai Chi movement classes in Brentwood that improves flexibility and balance. We will also be offering outdoor Walk with Ease in Concord starting Tuesday, January 12, 2021.

IMPACT DIABLO VALLEY FUND AT THE EAST BAY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION AWARDS MEALS ON WHEELS DIABLO REGION A GRANT TO LAUNCH SENIOR BREAKFAST PROGRAM

Impact Diablo Valley Fund at the East Bay Community Foundation has awarded an \$80,000 grant to Meals on Wheels Diablo Region. These funds will allow MOW Diablo Region to expand its Breakfast Bag Program to Bethel Island and Bay Point.

"Our mission is to reduce food insecurity for low-income and homebound seniors," says Meals on Wheels Diablo Region Executive Director, Caitlin Sly. "We are grateful for the support from Impact Diablo Valley Fund and for their commitment to improving lives in the senior community."

Bethel Island and Bay Point are two of the most needy communities Meals on Wheels Diablo Region serves. The grant makes it possible for MOW Diablo Region's Breakfast Bag Program to deliver a second meal of the day to an additional 40 vulnerable seniors, providing a total of 10,400 breakfast bags to clients who are facing hunger. The bags include nutritious food such as fresh fruits, yogurt, cereal, oatmeal, string cheese, hard boiled eggs, coffee, and tea.

MOW Diablo Region's mission is to improve the overall health of isolated seniors. We help seniors remain independent and live with dignity as long as possible. "The Breakfast Bag Program has been a real lifeline for me. It was the answer to getting the food I

need and it lets me know that I am not alone in the world," says Linda, an MOW Diablo Region Breakfast Bag client.

Irish poet Oscar Wilde said, "Ultimately the bond of all companionship... is conversation." If you ask 103-year-old U.S. Army veteran Leo, he would agree. Leo loves to talk! It's one of the many things that Meals on Wheels Diablo Region volunteer, Jeff Hall appreciates about him — and boy, does Leo have some good stories to tell! "Leo is one of the most interesting people I have ever met," says Jeff. "He served in the army during World War II, he's traveled the world, and when he was able, he enjoyed dancing. He continues to surprise me every day!"

Leo and Jeff's friendship started in 2018 when Jeff reached out to Meals on Wheels Diablo Region about their Friendly Visitors Program. "I was looking to get involved and find a sense of purpose in the community. That's when they set me up with Leo," says Jeff.

Leo was also looking for something to fill his days. MOW Diablo Region matched them up right away. The two discovered early on that they have a lot in common! "He served in the army and I've served in the navy," says Jeff. "We enjoy trading stories about our time in the service."

The two got to know each other over the phone, then decided to turn their conversations into an in-person friendship. "Leo said

he wanted to go out for a burger and a beer," says Jeff. That first meal together became a weekly "dudes' day" tradition.

Jeff would take Leo out to see live music in Danville, and occasionally host a dinner with some of his buddies so they could meet Leo. "Everyone agreed Leo had the best stories and sometimes we had to remind him to take a break from talking and eat some food. He really thrives in the presence of others."

Since the pandemic, Jeff and Leo have had to postpone their weekly burgers and beers. However, Jeff is committed to keeping Leo connected and engaged. "Fridays are hard on Leo; he feels like he's missing out on fun Friday night events."

Jeff also says, "although many of our visits are limited to me being on the other side of his screen door, at least it gives him some sort of outside connection. I can't imagine what it's like for people living totally alone."

Leo has adapted relatively well since Covid-19. Maybe it's because he's seen so much change in his very long life or maybe it's the connection he still has with Jeff.
