Rosario comes from a big family and at the age of 87, her extended family just keeps on growing. "I have 14 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren! One is only a few months old. I'm very blessed," says Rosario. Born in the Philippines, she and her late husband Joseph made their way to Martinez where they started a family that grew to the extended one she has today. Since Covid-19, Rosario hasn't been able to see much of her family, and with one son currently living in the Philippines, it is unlikely that they will be able to spend the holidays together. "I don't want them to worry about me. They have their own families now," says Rosario. "There's no way I could cook a big holiday meal anymore anyway."

Rosario reached out to Meals on Wheels Diablo Region back in 2018. One night, she was cooking dinner and forgot to turn off the oven. That's when she realized she needed some help. "After I was connected with MOW Diablo Region, I was introduced to another family at MOW Diablo Region. They drop off meals and are always so friendly," she says. "I very much appreciate the meals. They are tasty and help give me a balanced diet. Plus, I don't have to worry about cooking!"

The holidays can be hard on anyone, especially an isolated senior like Rosario. Here at MOW Region, we offer a wide range of services — not just meal delivery. We have a Friendly Caller program where volunteers make sure the seniors in our community feel loved and cherished. We also offer Friendly Helpers, to assist clients with picking up groceries or prescriptions, and Care Management helps with problems like depression and other social issues. All the services offered by MOW Diablo Region are designed to address the many needs of vulnerable seniors and help them remain at home, safely and with dignity, something that is very important to Rosario. "I'm so thankful for MOW Diablo Region. They help me like they are family," says Rosario.

This important event will give current and past volunteers, those who are on hiatus during the pandemic and prospective volunteers an opportunity to connect during these unique times. Volunteers will learn how as a result of the pandemic, MOW Diablo Region changed its procedures and delivery model to keep seniors nourished and safe, how it developed new programs to meet new needs, and hear heartwarming stories from clients. The agency will also offer its predictions for the future. "When people learn how we responded to Covid-19, they are amazed," says Executive Director Caitlin Sly. "Our staff and volunteers really demonstrated a masterclass in competence and success! We are so pleased that Pacific Service Credit Union recognized the benefit of bringing our volunteers together for this virtual event."

Volunteers are the lifeblood of MOW Diablo Region. They deliver needed meals to vulnerable seniors, help with social isolation by being Friendly Callers and Friendly Visitors, assist at cafés and with exercise classes, and provide office support. "MOW Diablo Region couldn't do the important work we do without our volunteers," adds Sly.

The Martinez Community Foundation has awarded Meals on Wheels Diablo Region a \$3,000 grant for its Weekend Breakfast Bag Program. The funds will be used to supplement the five weekly meals delivered to homebound seniors in Martinez who depend on the agency for their only meal of the day. The Weekend Breakfast Bags will provide a nutritious breakfast which helps prevent many of the health problems associated with food insecurity in the elderly and lessens the likelihood of seniors needing expensive hospital or nursing home placement.

The MCF grant will enable MOW Diablo Region to deliver Weekend Breakfast Bags to 42 frail and homebound Martinez seniors for six weeks — a total of 508 nutritional breakfasts — to help ensure that no Martinez senior goes hungry. "This program is so important at this time," says Caitlin Sly, MOW Diablo Region Executive Director. "Food insecurity is a problem for seniors in normal times, but it is especially problematic in these precarious times. We are extremely grateful to the Martinez Community Foundation for providing the funding that allows MOW Diablo Region to deliver Weekend Breakfast Bags to vulnerable seniors in Martinez."



Meals on Wheels Diablo Region is pleased to announce it has been awarded a grant from Share the Spirit East Bay, a project of the Bay Area News Group — East Bay Times. The funds will be used to purchase and distribute 40 electronic tablets for our low-income seniors. The tablets will allow seniors to stay connected with family and friends, access online health care appointments, participate in MOW Diablo Region's online exercise and fall prevention classes.

Social isolation is a profound problem for too many seniors even during normal times. Because of Covid-19, the seniors we serve are even more isolated. Loneliness and isolation can be as damaging as smoking 15 cigarettes a day.

"We appreciate that Bay Area News Group recognized how important tablets will be in helping the seniors we serve stay healthy and engaged during these difficult times," says Meals on Wheels Diablo Region Executive Director, Caitlin Sly.



MOW Diablo Region is hosting its first ever No-Show Gala which allows guests to "attend" whenever they want, from wherever they want and wear whatever they want! We are asking guests to make a donation on what they would have spent that evening on a ticket, an auction item, a babysitter, or a new outfit.

MOW Diablo Region planned a virtual gala, but we have been working double-duty since March, delivering meals and services to 40% more people. "We had a real quandary because we need to raise the revenue from a gala, but we also need to keep our focus on making sure vulnerable seniors are fed and safe at home," says Sherry Nadworny, Director of Development & Community Relations. "We thought this was a creative way to achieve both goals and we are so pleased that First Republic Bank signed on as a sponsor. They recognized that although the 'event' wasn't traditional, the need to raise funds is very real."

The No-Show Gala started on October 29th and runs until, "whenever you want," says Nadworny. "But we hope people will make their donation soon, because we have a waiting list of seniors who need meals and services." MOW Diablo Region also predicts that the need will continue to increase as Covid-19 goes into the winter.



For many of the seniors we serve, the only meal they have all day is the meal we deliver to them. We know this, not only because our seniors tell us, but because we see their empty refrigerators and pantries. No matter the challenges we all face, MOW Diablo Region will never let any of our clients miss a meal or a life-improving service.
