### **FULL CIRCLE**

Patricia heard about Meals on Wheels Diablo Region for the first time from people she waited on at Denny's in Pittsburg. "I'd serve many of the Meals on Wheels delivery volunteers who ate at my restaurant," says Patricia. "They were always friendly and easy to talk to." After waiting tables for over 55 years, Patricia finally retired at 70, but she never anticipated that an auto collision would bring Meals on Wheels Diablo Region back into her life.

"Honestly, I didn't see the other car," she explains. "I didn't know the accident happened until the driver got out of the car and velled at me." Although it was a minor collision, it served as a wake-up call, and she decided to stop driving. That's when she reached out to MOW Diablo Region. Patricia now receives home delivered meals and Breakfast Bags. "The meals are great, but I really LOVE Breakfast Bags! There's so much good food!"

At 82, Patricia is like many other older adults who depend on MOW Diablo Region. They are unable to drive, which makes having access to food more difficult. Inflation has also had an impact, driving up Patricia's cost of living. "MOW Diablo Region has taken the stress out of meals," Patricia explains. "I don't think I'd eat as well or as healthy without these deliveries!"

Patricia finds the delivery volunteers as friendly as the ones she met at Denny's. Sometimes they are the only people she'll see in-person that week. MOW Diablo Region deliveries serve as a wellness check, ensuring that seniors are safe. "It's always a joy to see the volunteers, my dog even gets excited!" says Patricia. "He recognizes their faces and greets them with a wagging tail.

I don't have enough words to express my gratitude for everyone who is a part of Meals on Wheels Diablo Region."



# POONAM KHIYARA PROMOTED TO DIRECTOR OF PROGRAMS



Meals on Wheels Diablo Region is pleased to announce the promotion of Poonam Khiyara to Director of Programs. In this new role, Khiyara will oversee Nutrition Services, Health and Wellness, Fall Prevention, Care Management, and the Outreach departments ensuring that each program continues its high levels of service. She will also plan for program expansion to meet the needs of the rapidly growing population of older adults in our community.

"We have experienced a tremendous demand for our services in the last three years. As our population ages, we need to provide services that address unmet needs," says Caitlin Sly, Executive Director. "Poonam has demonstrated that she has the knowledge, leadership skills, and creativity to help MOW Diablo Region continue to grow. She will help us ensure that seniors can remain nourished and independent, living with dignity."

Khiyara has held the position of Nutrition Services Division Manager since 2022. She joined MOW Diablo Region in 2018 as a Data Coordinator and then moved to Nutrition Services Assistant Division Manager. She started her nonprofit career as a volunteer with the Meals on Wheels of the Tri-Valley in 2016, where she eventually became the Program Coordinator. Before working in the nonprofit sector, she was an Interactive Media Manager serving clients in the consumer and technology industries.

## MAY IS MEET THE MATCH MONTH!

In 2021, Meals on Wheels Diablo Region joined five organizations to create the East Contra Costa County Senior Resource Initiative, and our first step was hiring Lidia Gutierrez as our Older Adult Specialist. The goal of the project is to increase connections to and awareness of social services among older adults living in East Contra Costa County. Through outreach, Gutierrez works with East County seniors who face challenges accessing services because of language, technology, or other barriers and she assists them in connecting with and receiving the community services that improve their lives.

In order to build on the success of the project, Meals on Wheels Diablo Region has been offered a \$20,000 challenge grant from the John Muir Community Health Fund to expand the program throughout the County. May is Meet the Match Month to kickstart this campaign that concludes on December 31st. Every donation received will be doubled up to \$20,000!

"The East County Initiative has exceeded all expectations," says Caitlin Sly, Executive Director. "Elders living in both West and Central Contra Costa County face similar challenges accessing important services. Meeting this generous match from the John Muir Community Health Fund will allow us to provide essential services to these vulnerable seniors."

## FEED THE SOUL



- Seniors are the largest growing segment of the population in
- the County, and without attention and planning, the number of seniors unable to access services will continue to increase. This project has been able to coordinate a network of service
- providers, both those provided by County government and community-based organizations that benefit vulnerable seniors. The partnership is a collaboration of Meals on Wheels Diablo
- Region, Choice in Aging, Empowered Aging, and Contra Costa Legal Services, with support from the John Muir Community Health Fund.
- "The John Muir Community Health Fund provided the seed funding to get the East County Initiative off the ground," explains Sly. "Our goal is to make this initiative available to
- our neighbors throughout the County. If we meet the match, we have the opportunity to raise \$40,000, because every gift will be doubled, but we need the support of our donors. We hope Meet the Match Month will be a big first step in meeting the \$20,000 goal so we can help seniors County-wide.



MOW Diablo Region held its third Feed the Soul campaign in February with the goal of raising \$28,000 in 28 days to help provide Breakfast Bags to our most food insecure seniors. This effort was made possible through the generous support of Chevron Corporation, NBC Bay Area, and Telemundo. An anonymous donor also helped with a \$6,000 match. We are happy to report that we met the match, but we came just shy of making the \$28,000.
