A SUCCESSFUL START TO MEET THE MATCH

May was Meet the Match month when we worked to meet a generous \$20,000 match from the John Muir Community Health Fund to expand our East Contra Costa Senior Resource Initiative Countywide. The match officially ends on December 31st, but the sooner we meet the match, the sooner we can begin providing this important resource to more seniors in need.

In 2021, Meals on Wheels Diablo Region joined Choice in Aging, Empowered Aging, and Contra Costa Legal Services with support from the John Muir CHF to create the East Contra County Senior Resource Initiative. The goal of the project is to increase connections and awareness of social services among older adults living in East Contra Costa County. Through coordinated outreach by Lidia Gutierrez, MOW Diablo Region's Older Adult Specialist, all four organizations connect with the hardest to reach seniors who face barriers to accessing services.

Because the project exceeded all operational expectations, the John Muir CHF has set up this challenge grant. Every dollar raised for Meet the Match will be doubled up to \$20,000!

"Meeting the match will be so important to our seniors," says Gutierrez. "I see the relief when a senior who is struggling and doesn't know where to turn finally gets the help they need."
